Lilleshall Abbey

The founding community was brought to Lilleshall Abbey from Dorchester Abbey in Oxfordshire and, as at Dorchester, for a time the canons followed the specific customs and daily religious observance of the important Augustinian monastery at Arrouaise in north-eastern France.

By the late 13th century, Lilleshall had become a religious house of great reputation and prestige. In all, the monastic life was maintained for almost 400 years, until the abbey was suppressed on the orders of King Henry VIII in 1538.

The surviving abbey buildings almost all date from the late 12th and early 13th centuries. Many other structures have been lost, their foundations partially recovered by archaeological excavations in the late 19th century. The central buildings stood in a much larger monastic precinct, enclosed by a stone wall and gates.

The Parish Council would like to congratulate all the pupils, head teacher and staff at Lilleshall and Muxton Primary Schools in achieving 1st and 2nd place respectively in the latest Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs) for the Borough of Telford & Wrekin as well as Donnington Wood Infants School for receiving the Most Improved Persistent Absence Trophy as it has considerably reduced the number of children being absent from school.

Christmas Festival 2011

The first ever Christmas Festival held by this Parish Council to celebrate the switching on of its Christmas lights was an outstanding success. The Parish Council

The event was opened by the Chair, Councillor Mrs Pat Green, and Mr George Whyte who was recently awarded the Freedom of The Borough by Telford & Wrekin Council. It is planned to hold the event again this year.

The Christmas Festival helped raise £100.65 which went to the Chair's Charity: the Severn Hospice Telford.



Allotments

Donnington allotments have finally opened and plot holders have already begun work on their plots. Some members joined those from Lilleshall allotments at a Christmas Party held at Lilleshall Memorial Hall on 17th December 2011.

Telford Green Gym at work: Hedgelaying along Newport Canal

Telford Green Gym is offering people the opportunity to join them to have a go at the traditional craft of hedgelaying.

Throughout March Telford Green Gym volunteers will be working in the Newport area. They will be spending the month hedgelaying along a section of the canal close to Bromfield Place. They will be offering an open day in which people can go along for the day to have a taster session of hedgelaying: this will be on Tuesday 27th March and on Wednesday 28th March the group will be going on a walk around the local area.

These activities are open to anyone over 18.

Telford Green Gym is a health and well-being project funded by the NHS on licence from BTCV, the conservation charity.

It offers people an alternative way to improve their health and well-being by getting involved in practical gardening, conservation and environmental activities.

It operates on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at sites across Telford and Wrekin and local people are welcome to join as volunteers.

Hedges are an important and well-loved feature of the British countryside, as well as being a valuable wildlife habitat. Neglect, rather than removal, is now the greatest threat to hedgerows, and many hedges need laying to encourage new growth from the base.

Hedgelaying requires skill and patience. It is always done during the winter months. It involves clearing away dead and overgrown brash from around the base of the hedge and up to approximately head height. Once this has been done then the stems of the remaining trees are cut part way through: this is known as pleaching. Once a pleacher has been cut the tree is bent over and laid down upon the previous tree. Hazel stakes placed within the hedge help stabilise it. The finishing touches are added in the form of hazel binders woven along the top of the hedge to add yet more stability. Any new shoots from the laid pleachers will grow up towards the light and help the hedge to bush out.

The Wrekin Housing Trust

The Wrekin Housing Trust has introduced a series of Estate Walkabouts every three months in response to tenant suggestions that regular inspections of their estates are carried out.

Everyone is welcome to get involved in the Walkabouts and residents can attend as many or as few as suits their commitments.

Walkabouts allow Trust officers and residents to work together to identify areas of concern that we are able to resolve, such as general external repairs and identify tenancy related issues, which need attention.

The Trust will also be working closely with other agencies in the area to address issues such as litter, graffiti, vandalism, abandoned vehicles, road and pavement improvements and lighting.

The Donnington walkabouts are currently well attended by our partner agencies, for example, the Local Policing team, and we would welcome support from residents. Residents who come out on the walkabouts will be 'rewarded' with coffee and biscuits after the walkabouts at the Trust office as a thank you for their time and effort.



Donnington and Trench Learners Trust

Donnington and Trench Learners Trust is the charitable arm of Sutherland Business and Enterprise College. It was set up in 2009 and with support from Fairshare, the Community Foundation for Shropshire and Telford, the Trust has appointed a Development Officer.

The Trust aims to raise aspirations and generate opportunities for local children and their families. The Trust has organised a range of activities including a Festival of Learning at Enginuity in Ironbridge, football coaching sessions run in partnership with AFC Telford United and motivational sessions with boxer, Richie Woodhall. The Trust has also supported a wide range of local initiatives including the Parish Council Christmas Festival, a Social Enterprise Roadshow and the new skatepark in Donnington.

The football coaching has been very successful and Sutherland is delighted to be hosting football coaching sessions and organising them through the Learners Trust for the local children and young people at local primary schools. All the children involved have enjoyed taking part and more sessions are starting soon. The programmes are run by AFC Telford manager and former England international, Andy Sinton, along with first team coach, John Psaras. The sessions have a focus on football but also encourage the children and young people involved to develop skills that will help them throughout life.

Coaching sessions also run every week at Sutherland and students involved are following the co-operative value of self help to raise money to enable the coaching to run throughout the year. The school is supporting the scheme financially and helping the students to raise their own funds.

The Trust is currently working with a range of different groups to put together a summer festival which will take place on Saturday 30 June at Sutherland Business and Enterprise College. The event is free and will include lots of fun activities as well as performances from local school children, taster activities for adults and stalls and sideshows. Social Enterprise Roadshow

Sutherland Business and Enterprise College is committed to promoting the skills, attitudes and qualities of enterprise to all members of its community. To celebrate Enterprise Week, staff and students offered all local primary schools the chance to take part in a workshop to produce items that they could sell at their own school fayres.

The Roadshow visited Year 4 and Year 5 pupils in St Matthew's CoE Primary School, St Luke's Catholic Primary School and Donnington Wood CE Junior School and over 90 children took part along with a team of ten students from Sutherland.

Year 9 Sutherland student, Rebecca White, commented, "We had a great time doing these workshops. The children were brilliant and it was a good experience for us too. I learned a lot of new skills in actually preparing the materials and then making the gift cards as well as supporting the children in the sessions."

School charity fundraising set to reach £1200

Students at Sutherland Business and Enterprise College in Trench have raised almost £1200 for charity since the launch of their House System last year.

Sutherland is sponsored by The Midcounties Co-operative and has adopted co-operative principles to support learning in all areas of school life. Each house has five guilds who work together and, whilst working out ways to raise funds for charity is a key feature of the school's regular guild days, some groups also take part in a range of community activities including a recent litter pick around Trench and Donnington. The Guild Days encourage students to work together and do something which makes a difference to others and makes a positive contribution.

Student groups choose their own charities and this year they are supporting Cancer Research, Help Harry Help Others, Help for Heroes, The Layla Jane Pitt Foundation and the NSPCC.

Headteacher, Steve Wall, said, "We are very proud of the ways the students have developed ways of working together to raise funds for worthwhile causes. They choose their own charities democratically and are really motivated to help others and as well as the guild days, they hold cake sales and attend local events to maximise their contribution."

Student groups are also involved in planning the Summer Festival, DFEST, taking place on 30 June. They are hoping to boost their charitable fundraising as well as learning about event management.

Donnington Skate Park

Shropshire's newest and best skatepark is now open! And it's in Donnington (Donnington Recreation Ground, School Road, Donnington)!

Featuring Shropshire's only freeflow skate bowl, the new skatepark contains a 1.2m Quarter pipe with 1.8m tombstone, flat bank, wedge bank, hubba ledge and handrail, pole jam, grind block, double set stair set and Shropshire's only concrete bowl (2m deep with clam shell and 2 hips).


The new skate park is attracting pro skaters / riders from across the country. If you want to have a go at skateboarding, in-line skating, BMX freestyle or scootering this is the place to be (spectators welcome)! Funding for a number of events throughout the year has been secured by Donnington Partnership from Fairshare. A programme of free community events (usually Saturdays 1pm-4pm) has been organised and will contain coaching for different sports on the skatepark and some community activities (such as gladiators / face painting / sumo etc). Helmets are compulsory in the skatepark in these events. A big event on Saturday 16th June will see lots of free activities all on the same day as a skate / BMX competition. See you there!

Our specific aims include helping parents understand their child's disability, campaign for change to improve services across the borough relating to the council, health, social care and education and to involve parents in the decision making processes that affect their children.
