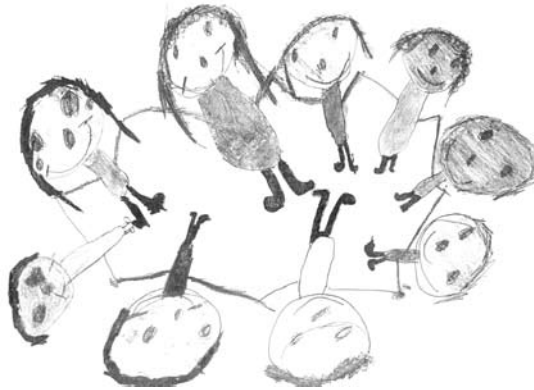

Donnington Partnership Charitable Trust is a locally based, multi-agency and community partnership based in the Borough of Telford and Wrekin. It formed in the latter part of 1995 initially as a need to address the unacceptable levels of vandalism around a parade of shops in Donnington that had occurred in the area that summer. Local community members, businesses and local service providers met to address those problems and work together on solutions and here the basis of a local community and service provider partnership was formed.

Donnington Partnership has often been cited in the Borough as a good model for partnership working. It is made up of workers from local agencies, service providers and authorities, residents and representatives from local community groups. Since Donnington Partnership formed it has implemented community development practices in its work, engaged with the local community and developed systems through which local community representatives can communicate issues and concerns.

How it works

In 2011 Donnington Partnership became a registered charity, with 6 trustees who have overall responsibility for the Partnership's business and an elected steering group that meets with the trustees to help address local issues that affect the quality of life for the inhabitants of Donnington.

Donnington Partnership co-ordinates and promotes its objectives through 6 thematic community projects and working groups that help to address local issues for residents around the subjects of:

- Community Safety
- Children and Young People
- Young Families and Health & Wellbeing
- The Community Café
- Older People
- Lifelong Learning

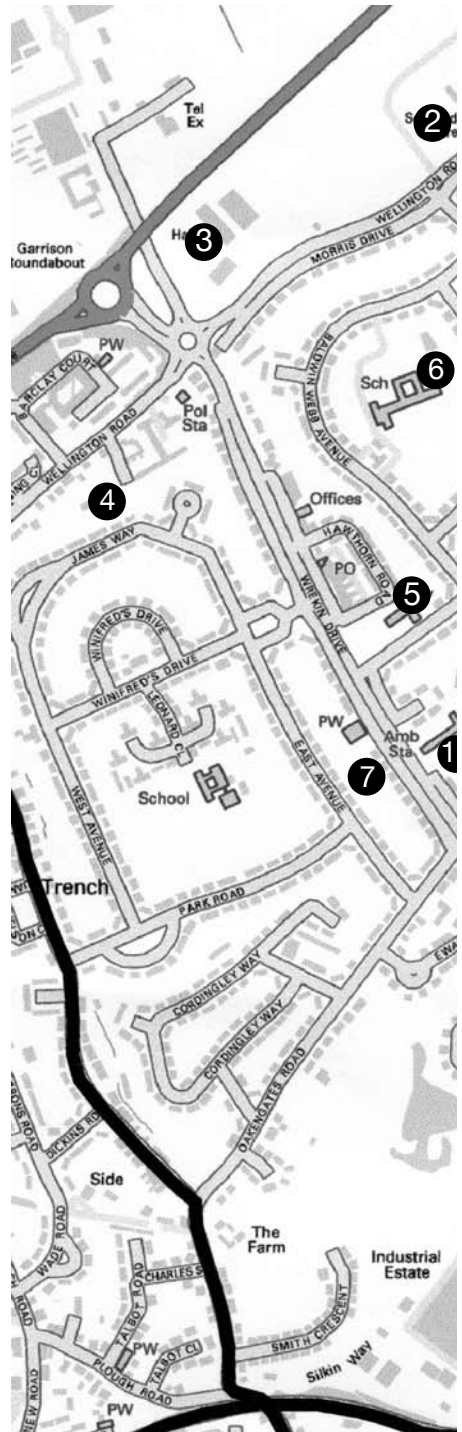

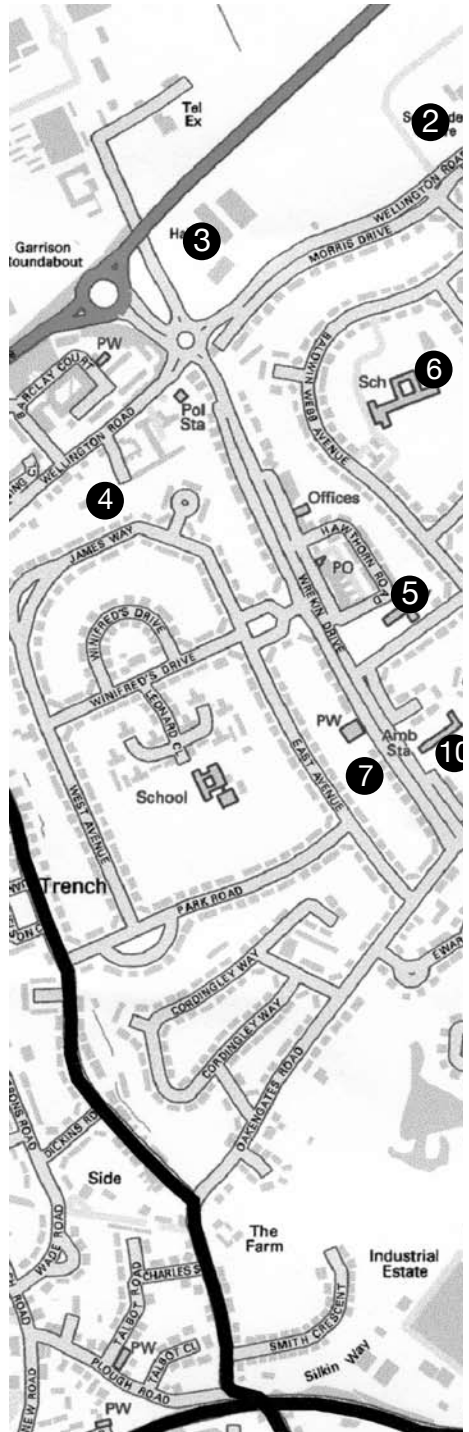
